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## News From Our Classroom

Welcome November! Hard to believe, but we just marked the 50<sup>th</sup> day of school on Friday. We've been very busy learning a lot in our class. In Math, we've begun learning about geometry, we started with comparing and classifying flat shapes and will move into solid shapes soon. If you would like to follow along using the free online curriculum, we are currently in EngageNY Module 2.

Speaking of Math, I recently signed up our class for an online math program aligned to our curriculum, called Zearn. We are switching from worksheet-based homework to online homework using Lexia and Zearn so keep a look out for additional information.

In Science we will continue our study of habitats and will also be comparing plants and animals. Related to this study of habitats, in Social Studies we have been studying maps and even made a map of the school with the 7<sup>th</sup> graders. We will continue this area of study with examining what maps tell us, different kinds of maps, and an upcoming map project where students will create a map of their neighborhood.

We recently began art with our school art teacher, Mrs. Baldonado. For our most recent project we created a mural of the ocean and then came up with ways that we could respect the ocean to tie into our grade-level global awareness theme of respecting living things.

In language arts, we've begun writing a lot more and have been practicing our reading in guided reading groups.
